ORGANIZATIONAL STRUCTURE

POLICY

Organizational Components

- 1. The Delta Police Department ("Department") maintains a formal structure through which the organizational components, functions, boards and committees are:
 - a) consistent with the requirements of the *B.C. Police Act* and its Regulations;
 - b) identified, defined, organized, directed and coordinated; and
 - c) clearly described to departmental personnel in writing through policy and by organizational charts.

Organizational Chart

- 2. The Department maintains and makes accessible to all personnel, an organizational chart that:
 - a) depicts the Department's organizational structure, and
 - b) reflects the Department's lines of authority and communication.

REASON FOR POLICY

- 3. To establish the functional components of the Department necessary to effectively carry out its purpose.
- 4. To clearly identify and describe the departmental organizational structure.



PROCEDURES

- 5. The organizational structure of the Department is as depicted in the current Organizational Chart. The Chief Constable may make changes to this structure as deemed necessary for the efficient operation of the Department.
- 6. The Department is directed by the Delta Police Board ("Board") in consultation with the Chief Constable.
- 7. The Chief Constable is responsible for the overall operation and administration of the Department and reports to the Board.
- The Department is broadly divided into Administration and Operations
 Divisions. A Deputy Chief Constable is specifically in charge of each of
 these Divisions and reports directly to the Chief Constable.
- The Deputy Chief of Administration will be responsible for providing a current organizational chart to Department personnel, the Board, B.C. Police Services and the public.

10. The current organization chart will be displayed on the Department Intranet and Internet sites.
