North Delta

Robbery

During the month of January five robberies took place in North Delta. Two robberies took place at Subway restaurants where an unknown suspect entered in the premise brandishing a weapon and demanded money. The restaurant employees complied during the robberies and sustained no injuries. The Delta police are currently investigating both incidents.

Next, the Delta Police responded to the 7000 Blk of 120th Street in North Delta regarding an armed robbery that had just occurred. On arrival police learned that a male subject was observed in a local grocery store choosing and concealing items then leaving the store without offering payment. Two loss prevention officers approached the

male outside of the store and when the suspect was confronted he produced a handgun threatening the loss prevention officers. The suspect, after leaving the items behind, fled the area in a vehicle. A license plate number was obtained and the Delta Police located the suspect vehicle at an address in Surrey in the area of 13300 Blk and 68th Ave. Rajveer Singh MUNDI 20yrs of Surrey, was arrested and charged with Robbery and was held for a Show Cause Hearing.

Another robbery took place in a store located at 8300 Blk 120th St. The suspect entered the store and demanded money from the victim. When the victim refused, the suspect slashed the victim in the hand with a box cutting knife. The suspect was later arrested by the Delta Police.

Finally the last robbery took place at a pharmacy where the suspect entered the premise demanding pain killers. The pharmacists did not comply with his demands and the suspect left the premise. The suspect was later arrested by the Delta Police.

Break and Enter Commercial

A total of 6 commercial break and enter incidents were reported in North Delta in January 2010. Majority of the businesses that were broken into were in the industrial area of North Delta, such as Annacis Island and 9000 – 10000 Blk of River Rd. Thieves targeted large items such as compressors, steam pressure washers and washing machines. In another incident suspects broke into a compound by cutting the fence and stole 28 new and used tires. Although, no suspects were arrested for commercial break and enter, because of increase patrol presence in the area the number of incidents has declined by 39 percent.

Break and Enter Residential/Other/ Seasonal

In January 2010 there were a total of 15 residential break and enter incidents reported in North Delta. The majority of the suspects gained entry via the front door, patio door and the window. The method of entry was by prying the window, lifting it from its tracks and kicking the door in. Some premises were entered via insecure windows & doors. In terms of property stolen, this month thieves primarily targeted: Tools, laptops, digital cameras, Identification and various other property.

Theft of Vehicle

During the month of January a total of 21 vehicles were reported stolen in North Delta. In six incidents vehicles had their ignitions tampered with, but were not stolen. A series was identified in January where approx 7 White vans were targeted. One suspect in relation to the series was identified by Surrey RCMP and another suspect has been identified, but no arrests have been made at this time.

In another incident, a John Deere excavator was stolen from the 9000 Blk of River Rd. Given the size of the excavator, a low bed trailer would be needed to transport the machine. The theft took place sometime overnight.

Vehicles were stolen by punching the ignition and/or defeating the steering column. Majority of the vehicles were stolen overnight or early in the morning from industrial areas. Vehicles were recovered in Delta, Surrey, Richmond and Langley.

Theft from Vehicle

A total of 48 vehicles were broken into in North Delta in January 2010. Forcible entry was used in most cases and the method of operation was by punching the driver's side door lock or smashing the side window. The temporal analysis reveals that most of the incidents took place overnight between 19:30 – 07:00 hrs, particularly between 01:30 – 05:30hrs. Items stolen had varied considerably and included the following: wallets, purses, Identification, GPS systems, credit cards and other miscellaneous items.

Mischief (Under & Over \$5,000)

A total of 43 mischief incidents were reported in North Delta in January 2010. Police were receiving mischief calls regarding vandalism to parks, damage to vehicles, and various other public property.

Other Theft/ Personal (Under & Over \$5,000)

In January 2010 there were a total of 43 other theft reports of which 15 incidents were related to shoplifting. Primarily retail shops along Scott Road were targeted.

SOUTH DELTA – Ladner & Tsawwassen

Robbery

There were no robberies in South Delta in January 2010.

Break and Enter Commercial

A total of 6 commercial break and enter incidents were reported in Ladner and Tsawwassen during the month of January. In one incident suspect broke into a pharmacy by smashing the window and stole 10 bottles of pain killers. The Delta Police is currently investigating this incident. Another break and enter occurred in an elementary school where the suspect attempted to break into a portable. The suspect was not successful in gaining entry and nothing was stolen. In another incident an unknown suspect smashed the front door of a business and stole \$500 in cash. Overall

the commercial break and enter incidents were occurring overnight with smashing glass. At this point no arrests have been made with respect to the above incidents.

Break and Enter Residential/Other/ Seasonal

In January there were a total of 6 reported residential break and enter incidents in Ladner and Tsawwassen. There was no particular pattern or trend to the residential break and enter. In terms of property thieves were targeting tv's, jewelry, Identification, Ipods and various other property. Further, in two incidents suspects were unsuccessful in gaining entry into the house.

Theft of Vehicle

In January South Delta reported 3 theft of vehicles. One Dodge caravan was stolen and later discovered after it was involved in a single motor vehicle accident. Another Dodge pickup was stolen and it was recovered three days later in Surrey. Finally, a 1999 Honda Civic was stolen and has not been recovered.

Theft from Vehicle

A total of 67 vehicles were broken into in Ladner and Tsawwassen in January 2010, with a significant spike in Tsawwassen. The suspects are primarily targeting vehicles that are left insecure overnight in residential driveways. Suspect(s) appear to be looking for any items left within the vehicle including small change, wallets, GPS and documents.

A number of possible suspects have been identified, but at this point no arrests have been made.

****NOTE:** Residents of South Delta are encouraged to lock up their vehicles while parked in the driveway. It is also important that no valuables are left in plain view.

Mischief (Under & Over \$5,000)

In January 2010 there were a total of 29 reported mischief incidents in Ladner and Tsawwassen. Vehicle vandalism, damage to park property and restaurants are just some of the examples of mischief.

Other Theft/ Personal (Under & Over \$5,000)

In January 2010 there were a total of 19 other theft incidents in Ladner and Tsawwassen of which 6 incidents were related to shoplifting.

2009 Stats Comparison by Month

Municipality of Delta Threshold Analysis (Robbery, B&E's, Theft of Vehicle and Theft from Auto)

Threshold analysis answers two specific questions:

1. What is the normal or expected volume for this type of incident, in this area, in this time frame?
2. How does the current activity compare to what's normal?

By answering these questions Delta PD can determine the types of exceptional volume of calls, those that have crossed the "threshold" from normal to abnormal. In order to calculate the "expected" volume for specific type of incident it is necessary to review the previous 5 years based on each month.
