

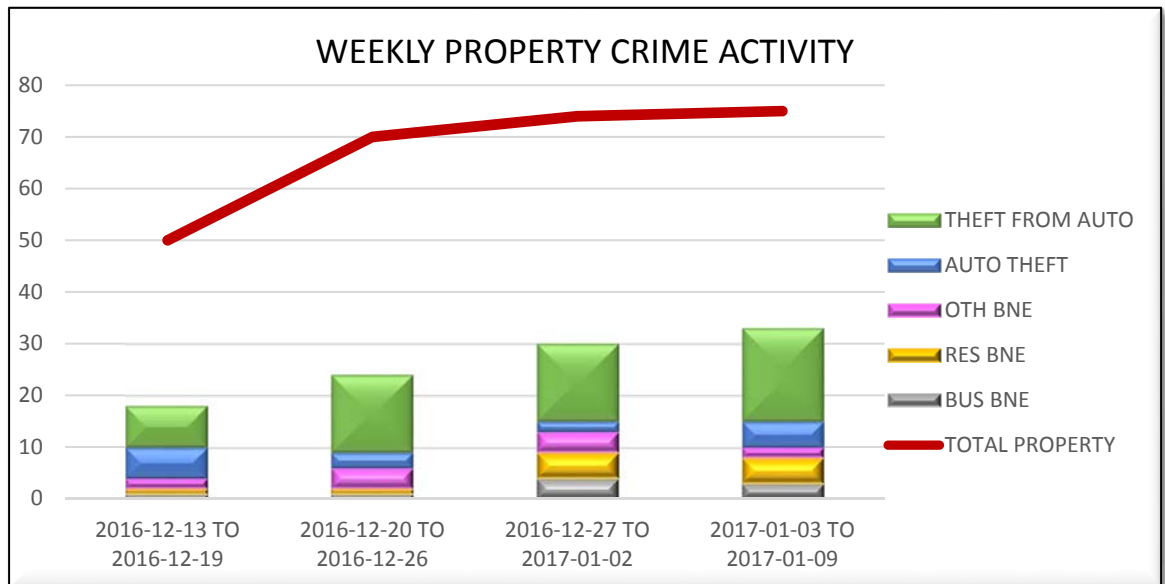
OFFENCE ACTIVITY WEEK IN REVIEW - 2017-01-03 TO 2017-01-09

D1: Tsawwassen D2: Ladner/Tilbury D3: North Delta/Annacis D4: Scottsdale

The year started on a bit of a high in both violent crime and property offences – Delta had 6 assaults this past week but nil robberies and moderate numbers in B&Es and Auto Crime.

Geographically we saw activity in all of the core areas, with the exception of Tilbury. And our area of concentration remained up north, in D3. D4 actually saw zero property crime files with the exception of one outside stolen.

PROPERTY OFFENCES

AUTO THEFT

We had 5 Auto Theft files in the last week, with all 5 of them occurring in North Delta, and 3 occurring specifically on Annacis. Of the stolens, all were trucks this period, with 2 of the vehicles being recovered to date, both in Surrey.

We also saw 3 recovered outside stolens in Delta – 2 recovered (Surrey stolens) in North Delta in close proximity to one another at 8900-9000 block at approximately 112th. These occurred also in close proximity to a Delta stolen. The remaining recovered was in D4 (Surrey stolen).

Of interest is the following:

Arrest – Surrey Recovered Stolen (139 – D3): A Surrey stolen was recovered in North Delta as a result of a traffic stop. Driver of the vehicle arrested. The passenger was also arrested but on an outstanding warrant.

BUSINESS BREAK AND ENTER

We had 3 Bus B&Es over the last week – with also all 3 occurring in North Delta, including 1 on Annacis. All 3 incidents were compound B&Es, resulting in 1 arrest.

RESIDENTIAL BREAK AND ENTER

Res B&Es were at 5 for the second week in a row, with 1 occurring in Tsawwassen (garage opener used to access garage) and the remaining 4 occurring in, North Delta. Of the 4 incidents, 2 were rear garage door access and interior locks picked (one attempt), 1 was a broken window, and 1 was a storage shed B&E. Time of occurrence is daytime, with the exception of the shed B&E, which is unknown.

OTHER BREAK AND ENTER

Oth B&Es were at 2 for the week – 1 being to Delta Museum (under construction) in Ladner, and 1 being to an underground storage locker in Tsawwassen (theft of bike).

THEFT FROM AUTO

TFA's were at 18 for the week with Ladner, Tsawwassen, and North Delta seeing hits and the area of concentration in D3. Of interest are the following:

Tire/Battery Theft Suspects (323 – D1): 4 tires were stolen off of a vehicle at South Delta Baptist Church, along with a battery stolen from a nearby trailer.

TFA/Mail Theft (303 – D1): A male was observed breaking the window of a Canada Post Truck and stealing mail in Tsawwassen. **Male suspect is described as Caucasian, slim, 30 yrs old, wearing a dark baseball cap and clothing, who fled in the passenger seat of a dark VW Jetta style vehicle.**

North Delta TFA Suspect Description (411 – D3): An interrupted TFA occurred in North Delta where change was stolen before the male fled. **Suspect is described as a Caucasian male, 50-60 years old, slim, with grey hair, wearing a dark jacket.** Suspect was on foot.

ADDITIONAL PROPERTY CRIME FILES OF INTEREST

Files of interest include the following:

Locker Theft (406 – D2): Ladner Leisure Centre was hit with a locker theft this past week, where \$12 cash was stolen. No suspects identified at this time.

Mail Theft (496 – D2): Community mailboxes were targeted in Ladner this period where the incident was observed in progress and the suspect male fled in a dark-coloured SUV with a spare tire on the back. 2 other males were inside the vehicle and all were in their late teens to early 20s. We have had several recent incidents of mail theft in the South Delta area.

Theft of Reader Board Batteries (559 – D3): 28 batteries were stolen this past week from reader boards in North Delta at 3 separate locations at Hwy 91. This is the second similar incident in recent months. No suspects at this time.

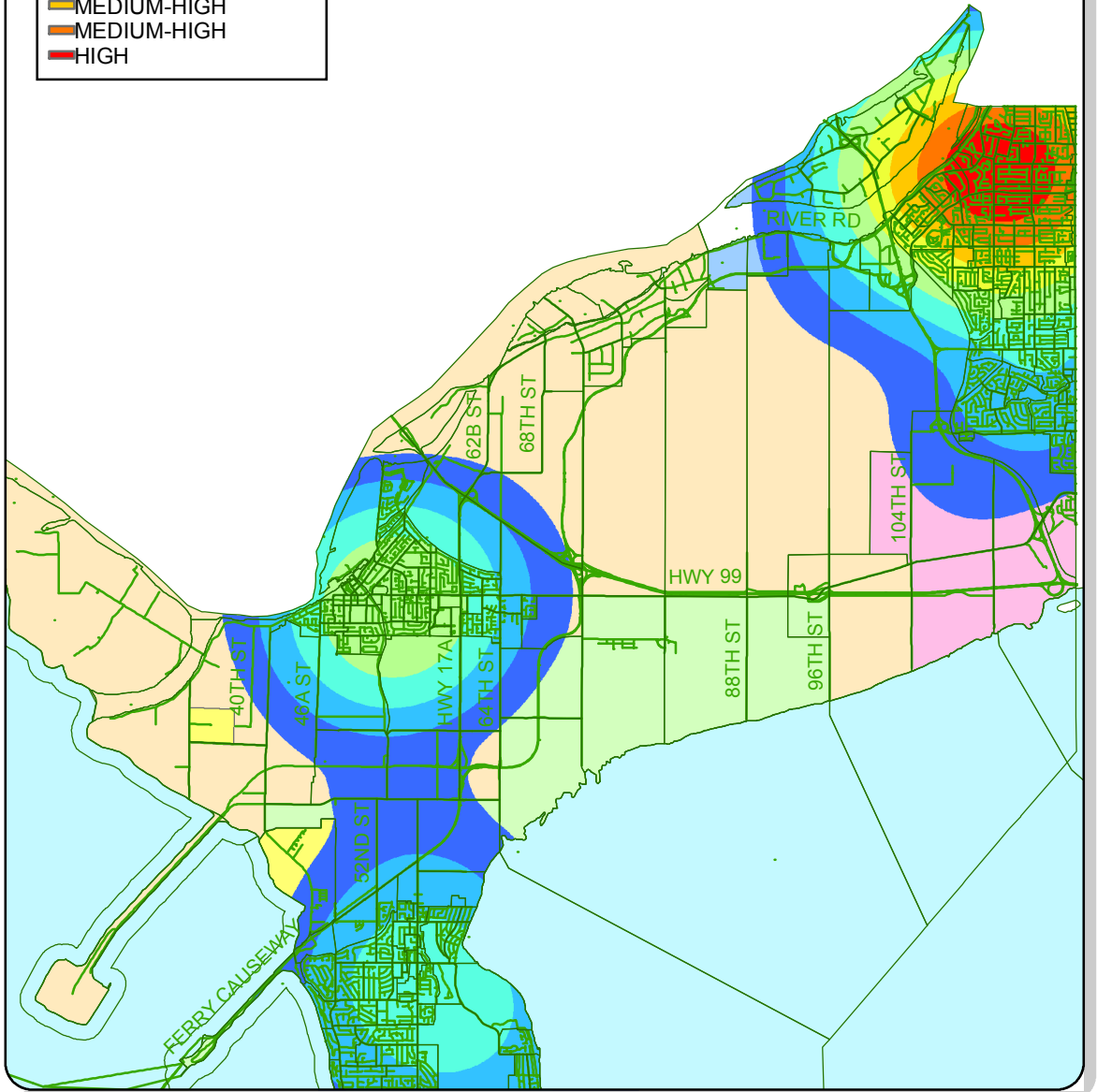


PERSONS OFFENCES

Persons Offences were at 11 incidents for the week – this included 6 assaults and nil robberies. Of the 6 assaults, 1 was an employee argument turned assault, 1 was a youth fight, 1 was a father/daughter dispute where father struck daughter, 1 was an intoxicated customer creating a disturbance at a store and then assaulting two civilians, and 2 were stranger assaults – 1 where COM was punched by an unknown male and 1 where there was an altercation on the street where COM said something to SOC before SOC punched COM in the face and walked away.
